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Beginning January 1, 2013, the withholding rate on supplemental wages paid to any one employee during the calendar year that exceed \$1 million is 39.6%. Previously, the withholding rate on supplemental wages that exceed \$1 million was 35%. For more information, see section 7. Withholding allowance.

The FUTA tax is 6% (0.060) on the first \$7,000 of income for each employee. Most employers receive a maximum credit of up to 5.4% (0.054) against this FUTA tax for allowable state unemployment tax. Consequently, the effective rate works out to 0.6% (0.006). 3.
