The cultural aspects of treating patients are similar for all age-groups, but certain themes have greater relevance with the elderly. "Cultural issues" is a complex construct that often seems vague and indirect. Culture is different from race. Race implies biological factors, while culture implies sociological factors.

Cultural Diversity and Caregiving. Rates of caregiving vary somewhat by ethnicity. For example, among the U.S. adult population, approximately one-fifth of both the non-Hispanic White and African-American populations are providing care to a loved one, while a slightly lower percentage of Asian-Americans — 18 percent — and Hispanic Americans — 16 percent — are engaged in caregiving (National Alliance for Caregiving (2009)).

Cultural Differences. Culture works to create differences in explanations of disease and treatment: Western biomedical allopathic health care has its own culture (e.g., knowledge, beliefs, skills, values) based on scientific assumptions and processes, producing definitions and explanations of disease. Older patients familiar with other health traditions may rely more on factors such as balance (e.g. yin/yang), or spiritual interventions (e.g. soul loss, or God's will) to explain physical ...
