The current suite of international food assistance programs began with the Food for Peace Act (P.L. 83-480), commonly referred to as “P.L. 480,” which established the Food for Peace program (FFP). Congress authorizes most food assistance programs in periodic farm bills.

Humanitarian assistance, and later, development food assistance programming, became the focus of U.S. international food aid. Subsequent administrations continued this emphasis. The Food Security Act of 1985 authorized the donation of USDA commodities by the Secretary of Agriculture in order to provide food aid to countries in need.
